


Now a days medicines became part and parcel of our life. The cost of the branded medicines is too high compared to generic medicines. So Government has launched generic medicines which was of the same composition of branded medicines at affordable and low cost.

Due course of time many misconceptions arised about this generic medicines.To create awareness and to avoid the myths about generic drugs we the department of chemistry have arranged a group discussion on " How will you justify the generic drugs are good compared to the branded drugs". 26 members are participated in group discussion .

Generic medications are a chemical copy of the original brand, with the same active ingredients. Generics are also available at a lower cost than brand-name medications. In fact, generic drugs cost 85 percent **Trusted Source** less than the brand version on average.

FDA gives patent and exclusivity **Trusted Source** protection to brand manufacturers to allow them to profit from their innovation and research for several years. During this time, no generics can compete with the brand.

Once the patent has expired, generics can enter the market through a shortened FDA approval process. Generic medications need to meet the same quality, safety, and effectiveness standards as brands.

Generic medications go through testing for quality, strength, purity, and potency to show effectiveness before approval by FDA. They must have the same active ingredient and provide the same benefits.

There are a few differences, however. Generic and brand medications don't look the same. Generics may have slightly different inactive ingredients (fillers, binders, flavors, etc.). These don't affect how the medicine works.

Many people have concerns about switching to generics and prefer brands. Some doctors also have concerns with certain medications. To be clear, this is a preference. These concerns might include:

- worsening of symptoms or condition
- side effects
- adverse reactions

- effectiveness
- safety
- quality

There are no laws that restrict the substitution of any FDA-approved generic or brand medication. It's up to you and your doctor to decide what's best for you.

You and your doctor can discuss if a brand or generic is the best option for you based on your comfort and budget. If you switch from a brand to a generic, you may need closer monitoring to make sure the medication is suitable for you.

Miss K.Allen Christina explained very clearly about the differences between generic drugs and branded drugs and how they works effectively.

Mr.K. Koti surya explains the misconceptions and myths of generic drugs. He told that quality is most important. Branded drugs possess more quality because of its high cost.

Mr.M.Rajasekhar explains that how does the generic drugs works effectively to the system.

All the students are actively participated in this discussion.After this discussion I can conclude them with facts against their myths.So that they can able to guide their elders in their family and neighbours which leads to minimum savings in their expenses.



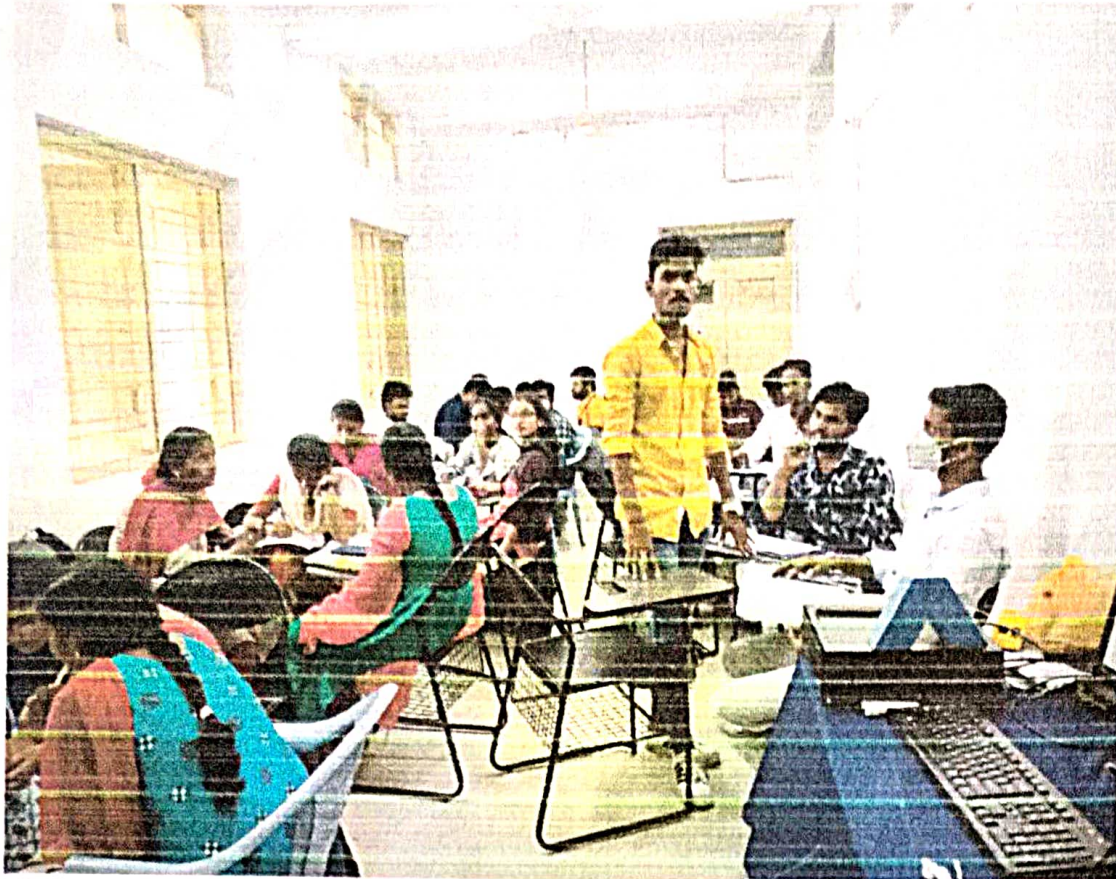

- Transactions to manipulate the data are controlled through the SET command, plus the COMMIT and ROLLBACK commands. And finally, other commands covered in this chapter include those that control a user's access to database resources through commands such as GRANT and REVOKE.

Background: Government of India issued a Presidential Order on 05/08/2019 to suspend the special status to Jammu and Kashmir and it passed in the Parliament on 31/10/2019 and became an act.

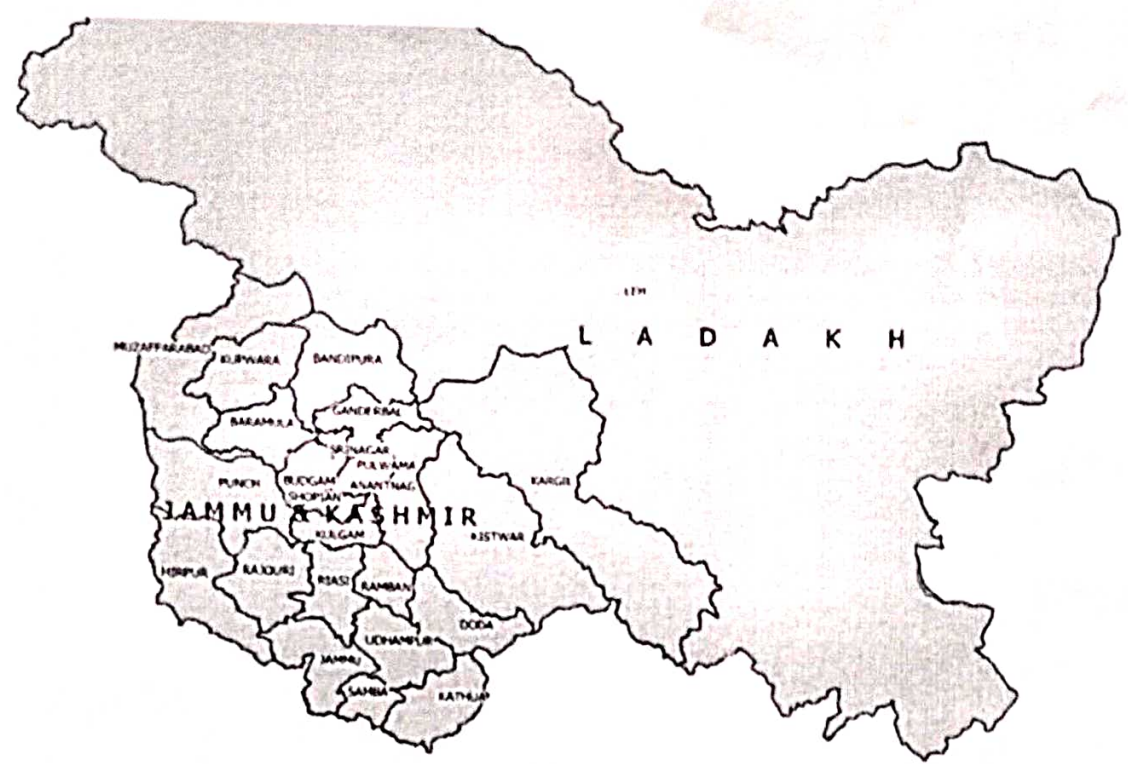

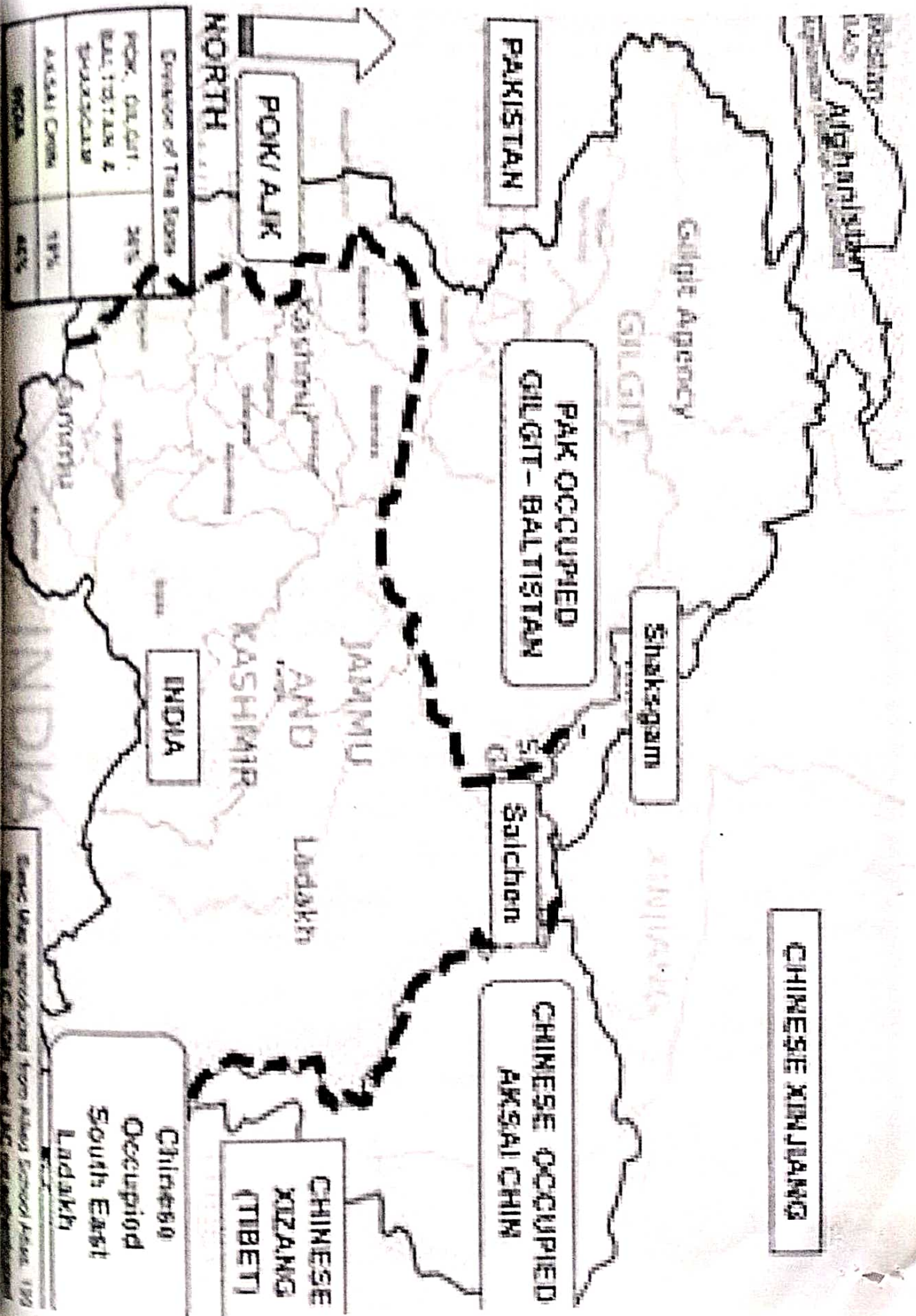
Jammu Kashmir Map

After the constitutional changes and reorganization of the erstwhile State of Jammu-Kashmir, the Union territories of Jammu-Kashmir and Ladakh have been fully integrated into the mainstream of the nation. As a result, all the rights enshrined in the Constitution of India and benefits of all the Central Laws that were being enjoyed by other citizens of the country are now available to the people of Jammu-Kashmir and Ladakh.

The change has brought about socio-economic development in both the new UT's i.e. UT of Jammu-Kashmir and the UT of Ladakh. Empowerment of people, removal of unjust Laws, bringing in equity and fairness to those discriminated since ages who are now getting their due along with comprehensive development are few of the important changes that are ushering both the new Union Territories towards the path of peace and progress.

With the conduct of elections of Panchayati Raj Institutions such as Panches and Sarpanches, Block Development Councils and District Development Councils, the 3-tier system of grassroot level democracy has now been established in Jammu and Kashmir.

This was stated by the Minister of State for Home Affairs, Shri G. Kishan Reddy in a written reply to question in the Rajya Sabha today.

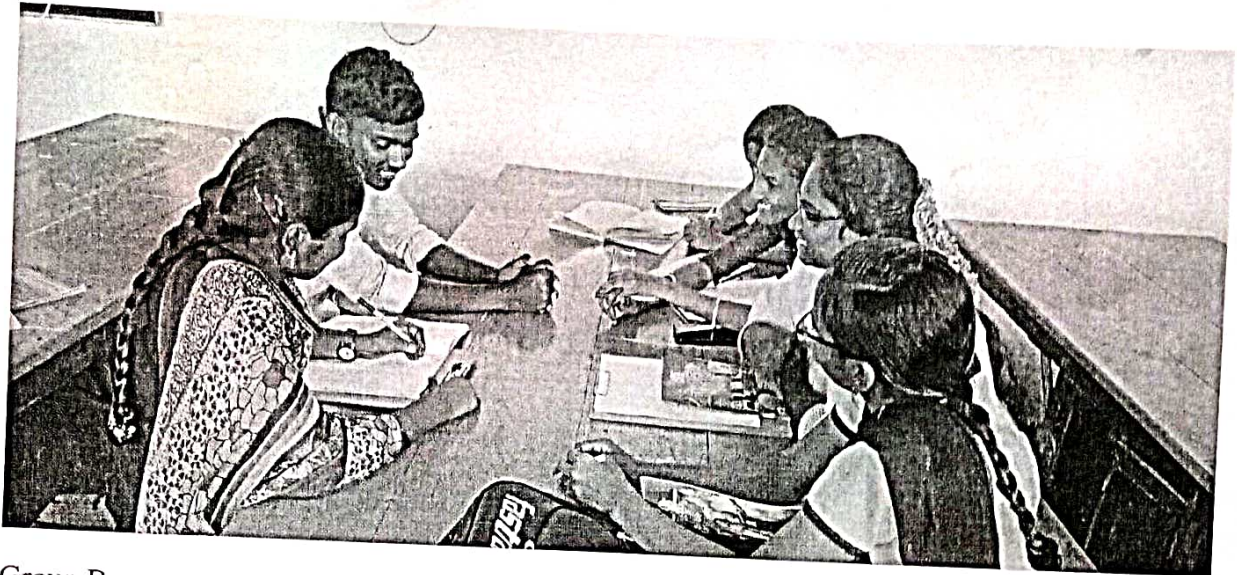

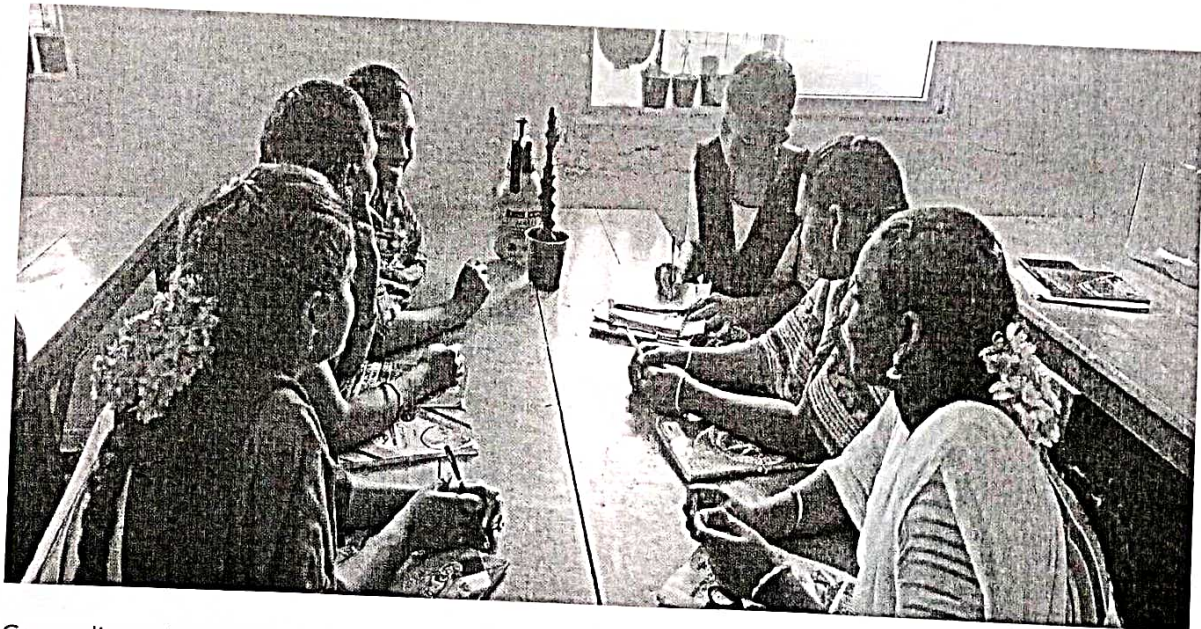
